ALMC<sup>ND</sup>DS: Brown Ret, Twig and Blossom Blight, Shothole, Scab, .eaf Blight — Use 50 lbs. per acre. Apply at popcorn, bloom and petol fall stages, 5 weeks after petol fall and 30 days to narvest. Hulls may be fed to fivestock. Subsequent applications may be made up to 12 days of harvest in accordance with pest infostations and State Agricultural Extension Service recommanlations, provided the hulls are not fed to dairy animals or animals being finished for slaughter.

APPLES: Apple Scab, Brooks Fruit Spot, Flyspecking, Bitter Rot, slack Rot, Botryosphaetto, Black Pox—Use 30 to 50 lbs. per acre. Make lirst application at delayed dormant period. Repeat applications for each infection period or at weekly intervals as long as necessary. CAUTION — Do not use in combination with or closely following or in alternation with wettable sulfur products on sulfur sensitive varieties of apples such as Red Delicious, Stayman, Baldwin, King etc., as severe injury and defoliation may occur.

CANTALOUPES, CUCUMBERS: Angular Leaf Spot, Anthracnose – Use 25 to 30 lbs, per acre on young plants, increasing to 40 to 50 lbs, per dcre on moture plants. Begin applications at first signs of infection and repeat at 5 to 7 day intervals or as needed to maintain control.

GRAPES, RAISINS: Mold Control on Fruit on Drying Trays in Field —Penicillium spp., Aspergillus spp., Botrytis Cinerea, Rhizopus spp.—Use 20 lbs per acre. Apply to fruit on trays for protection of truit and prevention of above molds. Apply to give even coverage. Repeat as necessary. Apply by ground or air. If applied by plane increase to 30 lbs. per acre.

ORNAMENTALS: ROSES — Black Spot. CARNATIONS — Rust and Leaf Spot. CHRYSANTHEMUMS—Flower Blight—Apply at first sign of disease to give even coverage of upper and lower leaf surfaces. Repeat at 7 to 10-day intervals as necessary. Charter Spot.

PEARS: Pear Scab (except Northwest)-Use 30 to 50 lbs. per acre. Make first optications during early finger and petal fall stages. Repeat opplications for each infection period or of weekly intervals as long as necessary. Russeting may be produced on Bose Pears. Do not use an D'Anjou Pears.

POTATOES (Seed Pieces): Damp Off-Dust at 15 ounces per bushel cut seed pieces (24 ozs. or 1½ lbs. to 100 lbs. cut seed pieces). Apply in convenient container or by duster attachment over belt. Cut pieces should be treated within 6 hours of cutting. If planting is to be delayed more than 1 or 2 days the treated pieces should be stored for 2 days in open crates before bagging. Do not use treated seed for food or feed purposes.

SOIL AND GREENHOUSE BENCH TREATMENT: Preplanting for Damp Off and Root Rot Diseases on Seedlings or Transplants of Roses (and other strubs and trees). Many flowers and Lawn Seedbeds -2.3 to 2.75 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft. (100 to 120 lbs. per acre). Work into upper 3 to 4 inches of soil before planting. Only the applicator is permitted to be in the greenhouse during applicatin of captan. Open vents to greenhouse during application and for at least 1 hour after application.

Workers planting in captan treated soil in greenhouses must wear chemical resistant gloves.

STRAWBERRIES: Botrytis Rol-Use 40 to 50 lbs. per acre. Make first opplication when new growth storts in spring before fruit storts to form. Repeat applications weekly. Severe Infection Conditions-Continue applications through harvest period, treating immediately after each picking.

TOMATOES: Early Blight, Late Blight, Anthracnose, Septoria Leaf -Spot - Young Plants - Use 25 to 35 lbs, per acre. Mature Plants -Use 40 to 50 lbs, per acre. Make applications at first sign of disease and continue at weekly intervals as necessary.
