TOMATOES: Aphids, Drosophila, Tomato Fruitworm, Tomato Hornworm, Armyworms, Leafminers, Stink Bugs. 25 to 40 lbs. per acre. **Russett Mites** 40 lbs. per acre. May be applied within 1 day of harvest on tomatoes.
