SPRAY ON GROW: Mixes readily with water and may be used in a 4 types of sprayers, from 2 temperature (50 to 80) per gal. of water. Spray plant thoroughly, especially upper and lower leaf surfaces. Begin spraying after 10:00 a.m. on sunny days.
