
The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, As Amended (FIFRA), is acceptable, provided that you submit one copy of your final printed label for each of the subject products incorporating the following corrections before you release the products for shipment.

1. Delete the following proposed reduced PPE for applicators: "When applying this product using the LOCK'n LOAD System, handlers are required to wear: Long-sleeved shirt and long pants, and Shoes and socks.".

As specified in the 4th paragraph of item 4. below, it has been determined that the subject lock'n load container system qualifies as a closed <u>loading</u> system. Unless the product is applied with a closed <u>application</u> system such as an enclosed cab, applicators are not permitted to wear reduced PPE. If the product is to be applied with a qualifying closed application system such as an enclosed cab, the 3rd paragraph in item 4. below provides for such a situation.

- 2. Correct the phrase, "closed handling system" to read "closed loading system" in the sentence, "The LOCK'n LOAD System, when used correctly, qualifies as a closed handling system under the WPS."
- 3. Replace the word, "required" with the word, "permitted" in the reduced PPE instructions.
- 4. Rearrange and revise the Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) labeling to read as worded below.

"Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Applicators and other handlers must wear coveralls over long-sleeved shirt and long pants, waterproof gloves, chemical-resistant footwear plus socks, chemical resistant headgear for overhead exposure, protective eyewear, chemical-resistant apron when cleaning equipment, mixing, or loading and a respirator with either an organic vapor-removing cartridge with a prefilter approved for pesticides (MSHA/NIOSH approved number refix TC-23C), or a canister approved for pesticides (MSHA/NIOSH approval number prefix TC-14G).

Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash Personal Protective Equipment separately from other laundry. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry. Wash all PPE after each day's use.

When handlers use closed systems, or enclosed cabs, in a manner that meets the requirements listed in the Worker Protection Standard (for agricultural pesticides (40CFR 170.2340 (d) (4 6), the handler PPE requirements may be reduced or modified as specified in the WPS.

The Lock'n Load system, when used correctly, qualifies as a closed loading system under the WPS. Mixer/loaders correctly loading this product using the Lock'n Load system are permitted to wear long-sleeved shirt and long pants, shoes and socks, a chemical-resistant apron, and waterproof gloves.

IMPORTANT: When reduced PPE is worn because a closed system is being used, handlers must be provided with all PPE specified above for "applicators and other handlers" and have such PPE immediately available for use in an emergency, such as a spill or equipment breakdown. The PPE required for applicators and other handlers must be worn when performing all pesticide handling tasks other than loading and application, such as spill clean-up and equipment maintenance, cleaning and repair."

If this condition is not complied with, the registrations will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec. 6(e). Your release for shipment of the products bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of this condition.

A stamped copy of the label for each of the subject products is enclosed for your records.

Cover granules that may be exposed on the ends of the treated rows, turns and loading areas by deep discing immediately after treating fields.

THIS LABEL SHOULD BE IN THE POSSESSION OF THE USER AT THE TIME OF PESTICIDE APPLICATION.

- Chemical-resistant apron.

When applying this product using the LOCK'n LOAD System, handlers are required to wear:

- Long-sleeved shirt and long pants, and
