*minimum toxicity for male albino rats= LD₅₀ of 500 mg/Kg

KEEP CONTAINER TIGHTLY CLOSED

GENERAL DIRECTIONS: Place tablespoon quantities of bait at 8-10 foot intervals where rats, feed, water, or travel. Bait placements along walls, in corners, and in concealed locations where rats can feed unobserved are desirable. Bait should be placed in locations not accessible to children, pets, and domestic animals; or in tamperproof bait boxes.

Before placing baits exposed food should be removed if possible. Refuse receptacles should be covered. Place baits in late afternoon or evening. If uncertain which food rats prefer, place baits without Red Squill as a test. Follow in two to three days with the Red Squill bait. Two more varieties of bait may be used in one procedure. Collect and destroy all eaten baits after completion of the control program.

TO PREPARE BAITS: Mix one part of Red Squill Powder with a little water or milk. Add 9 parts of corn meal, oatmeal, bread crumbs, whole wheat, graham flour, or bran, and knead thoroughly. Freshly ground raw meat is a good bait. Salmon or sardines may be substituted for meat. The Red Squill Powder may also be dusted over thin slices of fresh fruit or vegetables. Bananas, tomatoes, and melon are very acceptable. When using recognizable food change their shape by rolling, grinding, cubing, etc. Do not use foods which will be recognized by children. Do not use foods such as cookies, candies, nuts etc., which might be attractive to children. Red Squill is a violent emetic to humans and domestic animals. Meat and fish baits especially will attract dogs and cats, and when eaten will make these pets violently ill.

DO NOT RE-USE THIS CONTAINER: Punch holes in top and bottom and dispose of it in a safe manner.
