Select sturdy cuttings from healthy plants. Remove any flower buds or leaves from one or two nodes at the base of the cutting.

Dip the cutting into ROOTONE about 1/4 inch deeper than it will be set in the rooting medium. Tap off any excess powder and insert cutting in a hole in the rooting medium with at least one node covered. Make holes wide enough so that no ROOTONE is scraped off during planting. Firm medium around cutting to avoid air pockets.

Do not allow cuttings to become dry or wilted from the time they are cut until they are rooted. This is 3 to 5 weeks or longer, depending on plant species.

Among the plants that will root are azalea, barberry, boxwood, chionanthus, dogwood, euonymus, ilex (holly), juniper, pachysandra, pyracantha, rhododendron, rose, spiraea, lilac, taxus (yew) and viburnum.
