

GENERAL INFORMATION

Aerial spraying is a specialized job. Secure qualified technical guidance for each job and employ a competent reliable applicator. Become familiar with state laws governing the application of herbicides. Do not use aerial sprays in areas where possible spray drift may injure valuable crops or plants.

To protect a susceptible plant or animal, the weather must be favorable. Do not spray during high winds, rain, or fog. Do not spray during the middle of the day. 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DIRECTIONS

To control brush along levees, drainage ditchbanks and firebreaks of a solid stand of post oak, blackjack, or sand shinnery oak use the following:

PACKAGE 1 - SPRAY

Use 2 quarts of 2,4-DP per 100 gallons of spray. Spray is applied to the brush along the ditchbank or firebreak. The spray is applied to the root system as described on the chemical label. The spray is applied from the time the brush is fully developed until it is beginning to die. 2,4-DP is recommended for use on stands of post oak, blackjack oak in California, Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas and Oklahoma.

Amount per 100 Gallons of spray

Post & blackjack oak	4	5	10	Spray 1 gallon per acre of brush.

PACKAGE 2 - SPRAY

Use 2 quarts of 2,4-DP per 100 gallons of spray. Spray is applied to the brush along the ditchbank or firebreak. The spray is applied to the root system as described on the chemical label. The spray is applied from the time the brush is fully developed until it is beginning to die. 2,4-DP is recommended for use on stands of post oak, blackjack oak in California, Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas and Oklahoma.

Type of Brush	2,4-DP Oz.	Gallons	Gallons	Remarks
Post & blackjack oak	2	5	10	Re-treat the second year with 1 quart per acre.
Sand shinnery oak	1/2	1/2	30	Re-treat the second year with 1 quart per acre.
Package	1/2	1/2	30	

For aerial application to solid stands of brush in California use 2-4 quarts in 3-12 gallons volume per acre. Two to 4 quarts of fuel oil may be included in this mixture.
