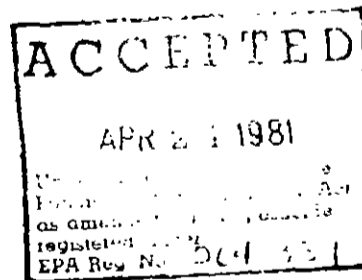

Do not make more than two applications after grain heads emerge from boot.  
Do not apply within 21 days of harvest of grain.  
No time limitation on use on wheat used as pasture or forage.  
Do not plant rotational crops not listed on the product label within 18 months following  
treatment.

Plant response precaution: To avoid possible injury to tender alfalfa foliage, do not  
apply to wet foliage or when rain or high humidity is expected during the next two days.

Alfalfa, almonds, apples, apricots, asparagus, bananas,  
barley (for forage only), beans, beets (garden), blackberries,  
blueberries, boysenberries, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage,  
carrots, cattle, cauliflower, celery, cherries, chestnuts,  
Chinese cabbage, citrus fruits, clover, collards, corn (fresh,  
including sweet), cotton, cowpeas, cranberries, cucumbers,  
dandelions, dewberries, eggplants, endive (escarole), filberts  
(hazelnuts), goats, grapes, grass, hanover salad, horseradish,  
horses, kale, kohlrabi, lentils, lettuce, loganberries, maple,  
melons, mustard greens, nectarines, oats (for forage only),  
okra, olives, parsley, parsnips, peaches, peanuts, pears, peas,  
pecans, peppers, pistachio nuts, plums (fresh prunes), poultry,  
potatoes, pumpkins, radishes, raspberries, rice, rutabagas,  
rye (for forage only), salsify, sheep, sorghum, soybeans, spin-  
ach, squash, strawberries, sugar beets, sweet potatoes, Swiss  
chard, sunflowers, swine, tobacco, tomatoes, turnips, walnuts,  
wheat.
