The Agency, in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, has completed reviewing all of the information submitted with your application to support the reregistration of the above referenced product in connection with the pyrethrins, cypermethrin, BPG and piperonyl butoxide (PBO) REDs, and has concluded that your submission is acceptable.

NOTE: This product is not being reregistered under sections 3(c)5 and 4(g) of FIFRA at this time.

Please be reminded that 40 CFR Part 156.140(a)(4) requires that a batch code, lot number, or other code identifying the batch of the pesticide distributed and sold be placed on non-refillable containers. The code may appear either on the label or durably marked on the container itself, and can be added by non-notification per PRN 98-10.

Please note that the record for this product currently contains the Confidential Statements of Formulation (CSFs) listed below. Any previously dated CSFs are superseded.



ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is extremely toxic to aquatic organisms, including fish and invertebrates. This product is highly toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment on blooming crops or weeds. Do not apply this product or allow this product to drift to blooming crops or weeds while bees are actively visiting the treatment area. Do not apply directly to water or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters or rinsate. See Directions for Use for additional precautions and requirements.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Do not use on horses or foals intended for slaughter. Do not apply over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth. Apply sparingly around ears. **Wash hands with soap and water promptly after use.** Do not use in outdoor residential misting systems. Not for use on horses intended for slaughter. Not for use in farm structures or buildings housing food producing animals or poultry. Do not make application during rain. When used as a spray, removed feed and water prior to treatment. Do not use as a space spray. Except when applying to horses, do not allow adults, children, or pets to enter the treated area or contact treated surfaces until sprays have dried. Do not apply this product in a way that will contact any person or pet, either directly or through drift. Only spray in a well-ventilated area. Do not spray when food is present. Do not allow product to contact animal's eyes, nose, mouth, or sores during application. Do not use on foals under 12 weeks old. Do not apply to pets.

SHAKE WELL BEFORE USING.

To protect horses from House Flies, Face Flies, Horn Flies, Stable Flies, Black Flies, Horse Flies, Deer Flies, Lice and Ticks, and from biting gnats such as Punkies and No-see-ums: thoroughly brush the horse's coat prior to application to remove loose dirt and debris. For dirty horses, shampoo and rinse thoroughly. Wait until coat is completely dry before applying CRASH! FLY SPRAY CONCENTRATE. Dilute at the rate of one (1) part CRASH! FLY SPRAY CONCENTRATE to three (3) parts water. For one quart of finished spray, pour eight (8) ounces of CRASH! FLY SPRAY CONCENTRATE into a one (1) quart spray container and fill with clean water. Always mix fresh solution before each use. CRASH! FLY SPRAY CONCENTRATE may be applied either as a spray or as a wipe. For horse's face, always apply as a wipe using a piece of clean, absorbent cloth, toweling (Turkish) or sponge. Spray or wipe horse's entire body while brushing against the lay of the coat to ensure adequate coverage. The amount of spray to apply will vary according to animal size and coat, but do not apply more than 3.1 oz per animal per day. Wear protective gloves when applying as a wipe. Do not apply more than 1 time per day. Reapply every 5 to 7 days under normal conditions after initial application. As protection builds, reapply every 10 to 14 days as needed. Also, reapply each time the animal is washed or exposed to rain.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Store in a cool, dry place inaccessible to children and pets. Always store pesticides in the original container. If a leaky container must be contained within another, mark the outer container to identify the contents. Keep pesticide storage areas clean. Clean up any spills promptly. Store pesticides away from food, pet food, seed, fertilizers, and veterinary supplies.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL AND CONTAINER HANDLING: Nonrefillable. Do not reuse or refill this container. **If Empty:** Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. **If Partly Filled:** Call your local solid waste agency for disposal instructions. Never place unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain.
