Dear Ms. Chavez:

The Agency in accordance with the Federal Fungicide and Rodenticide Act as Amended (FIFRA) has completed reviewing all of the information submitted with your application to support the reregistration of the aforementioned product in connection the **MGK 326 RED**, and have concluded that your submission is acceptable.

The Agency is in the process of developing and improving the current Efficacy Assessment Guidelines for repellent products. The Agency intends to defer the determination of any related efficacy data requirements supporting the claims that may appear on this label until these Efficacy Assessment Guidelines are complete. When the guidelines are finalized, the Agency expects to issue a Data Call-In to address the revised guidelines to all registrants with registrations for personal repellent products that have not previously submitted efficacy data sufficiently consistent with the revised guidelines.

NOTE: This product is not being re-registered under FIFRA Sec. 4(g) at this time.

Farnam Companies, Inc. should also note that a notice of availability of EPA's reregistration eligibility decision (RED) documents for products containing:

- Cypermethrin was published in the Federal Register on March 19, 2008 (Volume 73, Number 54, Page 14793).
- Pyrethrins was published in the Federal Register on July 26, 2006 (Volume 71, Number 143, Pages 42387-42389).
- Piperonyl butoxide was published in the Federal Register on July 26, 2006 (Volume 71, Number 143, Pages 42385-42386).
- Butoxypolypropylene glycol was published in the Federal Register: December 21, 2007 (Volume 72, Number 245 Page 72713-72715).

As a result of these REDs, additional data and/or labeling changes may be required for products containing pyrethrins and/or piperonyl butoxide, Cypermethrin, and Butoxypolypropylene glycol.



ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters or rinsate.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Do not use on horses or foals intended for slaughter. Do not apply over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth. Apply sparingly around ears.

To protect horses from House Flies, Face Flies, Horse Flies, Stable Flies, Black Flies, Horse Flies, Deer Flies, Lice and Ticks and from biting gnats such as Punkies and No-see-ums: thoroughly brush the horse's coat prior to application to remove loose dirt and debris. For best results shampoo and rinse; wait until coat is completely dry and apply CRASH! WIPE-ON INSECTICIDE/REPELLENT. Using protective gloves or mitt, apply a light film of two to four fluid ounces (60-120 ml) over horse's entire body, or spot treat areas of the horse where flies gather. May be applied around superficial wounds and abrasions. Avoid direct application to eyes, nose and mouth. Repeat application as necessary but no more often than once every 5 to 7 days. Wash hands with soap and water after use.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Store in a cool, dry place inaccessible to children and pets. **DISPOSAL:** If empty: Do not reuse this container. Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. If partly filled: Call your local solid waste agency or call 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions.
