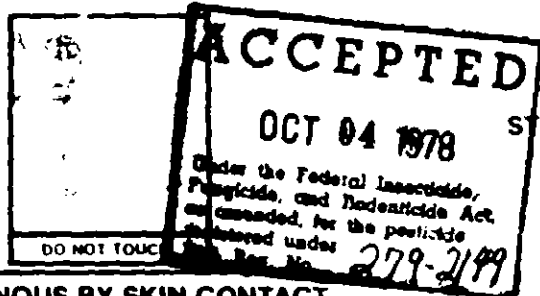
### FIRST AID TREATMENT

Call a doctor, physician, or hospital immediately. Explain that the victim has been exposed to methyl parathion and describe condition. If breathing has stopped, start artificial respiration immediately. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. See doctor immediately.

### NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Since any symptoms from absorption of this combination product are likely to be those of methyl parathion intoxication, treatment should be directed towards the relief of cholinesterase inhibition.

Antidote: Atropine, 1 mg. subcutaneous, repeat every 30 minutes until symptoms are relieved. Repeat at 15 minute intervals until signs of atropine appear. Atropine is a cholinesterase inhibitor. It may be administered in 1 mg. increments. MORPHINE OR TRANQUILIZERS: Methyl Parathion is a strong cholinesterase inhibitor affecting the central and peripheral nervous systems. It produces cardiac and respiratory depression. First sign of pulmonary edema, the patient should be given supplemental oxygen and treated symptomatically. Control of the pulse, blood pressure and fatality rates have been reported after intravenous administration. SUPERVISION OF THE PATIENT IS INDICATED. See also FMC Bulletin.

**POISONOUS BY SKIN CONTACT**

Poisonous if touched by hands or spilled or splashed on skin, in eyes or on clothing. Liquid goes through clothes.



**POISONOUS IF BREATHED**

Breathing spray or dust may be fatal if inhaled.

**POISONOUS TO FISH AND WILDLIFE**

**POISON SIGNS (Symptoms):**

METHYL PARATHION is a very dangerous poison. It rapidly enters the body on contact with all skin surfaces and eyes. Clothing wet with this material must be removed immediately. Exposed persons must receive prompt medical treatment or they may die.

Some of the signs and symptoms of poisoning are: Headache, nausea, vomiting, cramps, weakness, blurred vision, pin-point pupils, tightness in chest, labored breathing, nervousness, sweating, watering of eyes, drooling or frothing of mouth and nose, muscle spasms and coma.

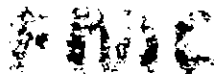
