Your label submission dated October 26, 1995 and Your request for comments dated January 16, 1996

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA section 3(c)(7)(a), is acceptable provided that you make the following revisions at the next label printing (or, if possible, at this time if actual product label printing has not yet begun):

- Under the ingredients statement, revise "*** Contains xylene range aromatic solvents" to read "*** Contains xylene range aromatic solvent".
- 2. In the Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals, under POISONOUS BY SKIN CONTACT, replace "Harmful if absorbed though skin. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing" with "Fatal if absorbed though skin. Do not get on skin, in eyes, or on clothing." The Agency apologizes for the incorrect text conveyed in item "1" of our September 6, 1994 letter which did not adequately address the Toxicity Category I nature of this product by that route of exposure.
 - 3. In the ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS, revise "Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes." to read "Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of equipment washwaters.".

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4. Directly under the heading GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS, add "Not for use or storage in or around the home.". In the Pesticide Storage section of the STORAGE AND DISPOSAL directions, you may retain "Not for use or storage in or around the home." or you may modify it at that location to read "Do not store in or around the home.", since this section pertains only to pesticide storage.

if breathing has stopped, start artificial respiration immediately and maintain until doctor sees victim.

If swallowed: Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Consideration should be given to reducing ingestion exposure by gastric lavage with an endotracheal tube in place. Vomiting should be induced under medical supervision. Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by giving one ounce of syrup of ipecac or by touching the back of the throat with a finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to a person who is unconscious or convulsing. Do not give animal or vegetable lats, as they enhance absorption of endosulfan.
