Dear Mr. Meindl:

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The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under section 3(c)(7)(A) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable provided that you:

- 1. Submit/cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 3(c)(5) or 4(a) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
- 2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:
 - a. Under PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS, add the following statement to the end of the paragraph under "Caution": "Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling".
 - b. Add the following statement near the first aid statements: "Have the product container or label with you when calling a poison control center or doctor or going for treatment."
 - c. The retreatment statements should include a maximum frequency of application, such as: "... but not more than ____ times per ___." Specifically noted under MIXING DIRECTIONS, page 6.
 - d. Under DIRECTIONS FOR USE, after the statement "Do not apply by air," add the following: "Do not apply by any kind of irrigation system."

- e. Under GRASS APPLICATION RATES, it appears that footnote #11 provides additional clarity to the statement, "However, at the discretion of the applicator...". In order to avoid confusion with the series of footnotes which follow, cite footnote #11 at the end of that paragraph.
- 3. Submit two copies of your final printed labeling before you release the above referenced product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

IMPREGNATION AND APPLICATION OF TALSTAR ON DRY BULK TURF FERTILIZERS

Talstar[®] GC Flowable insecticide/miticide may be impregnated on dry bulk fertilizers. When applied as directed, Talstar/dry bulk fertilizer mixtures provide insect control equal to that provided by the same rates of Talstar applied in water.

Impregnation: Apply using a minimum of 100 pounds of dry bulk fertilizer per acre with the recommended amount of Talstar insecticide/mitcide per acre. Use a closed rotary-drum mixer or a similar type of closed blender equipped with suitable spray equipment. The spray nozzle(s) should be positioned to provide a uniform, fine spray pattern over the tumbling fertilizer for thorough coverage. The physical properties of fertilizers vary, particularly in liquid absorptive capacity. When absorptivity is sufficient, simple spray impregnation of the fertilizer with Talstar provides a satisfactory, dry mixture. If the absorptive capacity is inadequate, use of a highly absorptive powder is required to provide a dry, flowable mixture. Microcel E (Johns-Manville Products Corporation) is a recommended absorbent powder. Generally less than 2% by weight of Microcel E is required. DO NOT impregnate Talstar onto straight coated ammonium nitrate or straight limestone because these materials will not absorb the insecticide. Dry fertilizer blends containing mixtures of ammonium nitrate or limestone may be impregnated with Talstar.

The amount of Talstar actually required in the preparation of individual fertilizer mixtures should be determined carefully for each production operation. This is necessary to ensure that the amount of pesticide actually contained in the mixture applied to the soil represents the correct rate of use. Bulk fertilizer impregnated with Talstar insecticide/mitticide should be applied immediately, not stored.

All individual Federal and State regulations relating to bulk dry fertilizer blending, registration, labeling, and application of the mixtures are the responsibility of the individual and/or company selling the fertilizer and Talette mixture.

Fertilizer for this use should be Turf fertilizers recommended for specific regions.

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General Applications Instructions

Talstar GC Flowable formulation mixes readily with water and other aqueous carriers, and controls a wide spectrum of insects and mites on ornamentals, trees, shrubs, foliage plants, non-bearing fruit and nut trees, and flowers in interiorscapes including hotels, shopping malls, office buildings, etc., and, outdoor plantscapes, such as around residential dwellings, parks, institutional, public, commercial and industrial buildings, recreational, athletic fields, home lawns, golf courses and sod family Non-bearing crops are perennial crops that will not produce a harvestable raw agricultural commodity during the season of application.

Talstar GC Flowable may be tank-mixed with other products, including insect growth regulators. When tank mixing Talstar GC with other products, observe all precautions and limitations on each separate product label. The physical compatibility of Talstar GC may vary with different sources of pesticide products, and local cultural practices. Any tank mixture which has not been previously tested should be prepared on a small scale (pint or quart jar), using the proper proportions of chemicals and water to ensure the physical compatibility of the mixture.

The following procedure is recommended for preparation of a new tank mix, unless specified otherwise in label directions: (1) Add wettable powders to tank water, (2) Agitate, (3) Add liquids and flowables, (4) Agitate, (5) Add emulsifiable concentrates, and (6) Agitate. If a mixture is found to be incompatible following this order of addition, try reversing the order of addition, or increase the volume of water. Note: If the tank-mixture is found to be compatible after increasing the amount of water, then the sprayer will need to be recalibrated for a higher volume application. Do not allow tank mix to stand overnight.

Maximum rates: Do not apply more than 0.1 lb ai/acre (20 ft, ozs. Talstar GC Flowable) in a single application, no more than 0.2 lb ai/acre/year (40 ft, ozs. Talstar GC Flowable) for outdoor applications.

Note: For large infestations of ants, imported fire ants, and mole crickets, a single application of 0.2 lb ai/acre (40 fl. ozs of Talstar GC Flowable) may be applied once per year.

Resistance: Some insects are known to develop resistance to products used repeatedly for control. Because the development of resistance cannot be predicted, the use of this product should conform to resistance management strategies established for the use area. Consult your local or state pest management authorities for details.

If resistance to this product develops in your area, this product, or other products with a similar mode of action, may not provide adequate control. If poor performance cannot be attributed to improper application or extreme weather conditions, a resistant strain of insect may be present. If you experience difficulty with control and suspect that resistance is a reasonable cause, immediately consult your local company representative or pest management advisor for the best alternative method of control for your area.

APPLICATION RECOMMENDATIONS

Grass Areas (Including golf courses, sod farms, home lawns, lawn areas around parks, institutional, public, commercial and industrial buildings, recreational and athletic fields).

Apply Talstar GC as a surface or sub-surface treatment. Use application volumes of up to 10 gallons per 1000 square feet to get uniform coverage when treating dense and or long grass foliage.

For low volume applications, less than 2 gallons/1000 square feet, immediate irrigation of treated area with at least 0.25 inches of water following application to ensure efficacy of sub-surface pests such as, but not limited to, Mole Crickets, is recommended.

GRASS APPLICATION RATES

The application rates listed in the following table will provide control of the respective pests under typical conditions. However, at the discretion of the applicator, Talstar GC may be applied at up to 0.1 lb ai/A (20 fl. ozs.) to control each of the pests listed in this Table. (0.2 lb Al/A or 40 fl. ozs. for ants, imported fire ants and mole crickets).

In New York State, this product may NOT be applied to any grass or turf area within 100 feet of a water body (lake, pond, river, stream, wetland, or drainage ditch).

In New York State, do make a single repeat application of Talstar GC if there are signs of renewed insect activity, but not sooner than two weeks after the first application.

Armyworms, Cutworms and Sod Webworms: To ensure optimum control, delay watering (irrigation) or mowing for 24 hours after application. If the grass area is being maintained at a mowing height of greater than 1 inch, then higher application rates (Up to 0.1 b ai/A or 20 ft, ozs. of Talstar GC Flowable) may be required during periods of high pest pressure.

²Annual Bluegrass Weevil (Hyperodes) adults: Applications should be timed to control adult weevils as they eave their overwintering sites and move into grass areas. This movement generally begins when Forsytnia is in full bloom and concludes when flowering dogwood (Corcus florida) is in full bloom. Consult your State Cooperative Extension Service for more specific information regarding application timing

³Billbug adults: Applications should be made when adult billbugs are first observed during April and May. Degree day models have been developed to optimize application timing. Consult your State Cooperative Extension Service for information specific to your region. In temperate regions, spring applications targeting billbug adults will also provide control of over-wintered chinch bugs.

*Black Turfgrass Ataenius adults: Applications should be made during May and July to control the first and second generation of black turfgrass ataenius adults, respectively. The May application should be timed to coincide with the full blorn stage of Vanhoutte spiraea (*Spiraea vanhouttei*) and horse chestnut (*Aesculus hippocastanum*). The July application should be timed to coincide with the

blooming of Rose of Sharon (Hibiscus synacus).

⁵Chinch Bugs: Chinch Bugs infest the base of grass plants and are often found in the thatch layer. Irrigation of the grass area before treatment will optimize the penetration of the insecticide to the area where the chinch bugs are located. Use higher volume applications if the thatch layer is excessive or if a relatively long mowing height is being maintained. Chinch Bugs can be one of the most discult pests to control in grasses and the higher application rates (Up to 0.1 lb ai/A or 20 fl. ozs. of Talstar GC Flowable) may be required to control populations that contain both nymphs and adults during the middle of the summer.

Mittes: To ensure optimal control of enophyld mites, apply in combination with the labeled application rate of a surfactant. A second application, five to seven days after the first, may be necessary to achieve control.

⁷Mole Cricket adults: Achieving control of adult mole crickets is difficult because preferred grass areas are subject to continuous invasion during the early spring by this extremely active stage. Applications should be made as late in the day as possible and should be watered in with up to 0.5 inches of water immediately after treatment. If the soil is not moist, then it is important to irrigate before application to bring the mole crickets closer to the soil surface where contact with the insecticide will be maximized. Grass areas that receive pressure from adult mole crickets should be treated at peak egg hatch to ensure optimum control of subsequent mymoh populations (see below). quent nymon populations (see below)

^aMole Cricket nymphs: Grass areas that received intense adult mole cricket pressure in the spring should be treated immediately prior to peak egg hatch. Obtimal control is achieved at this time because young nymphs are more susceptible to insecticides and they are located near the soil surface where the insecticide is most concentrated. Control of larger, more damaging, nymphs later in the year may require both higher application rates and more trequent applications to maintain acceptable control. Applications should be made as late in the day as possible and should be watered in with up to 0.5 inches of water immediately after treatment. If the soil is not most, then it is important to triggate before application to bring the mole crickets closer to the soil surface where contact with application to bring the mole crickets closer to the soil surface where contact with the insectoide will be maximized.

³Flea larvae: Flea larvae develop in the soil of shaded areas that are accessible to pets or other animals. Use a higher volume application when treating these areas to ensure penetration of the insecticide into the soil. Note: if the lawn area is being treated with Talstar® GC Flowable insectioid/mitticide at 0.05 b. at/A (10 fl. ozs.) for adult flea control, then the larval application rate may be achieved by doubling the application volume.

10 Ticks: Do not make spot applications. Treat the entire area where exposure to ticks may occur. Use higher spray volumes when treating areas with dense ground cover or heavy leaf litter. Ticks may be reintroduced from surrounding areas on host animals. Retreat as necessary to maintain adequate control. Do not allow public use of treated areas during application or until sprays have dried.

Deer ticks (Ixodes sp.) have a complicated life cycle that ranges over a two year period and involves four life stages. Applications should be made in the late fall and/or early spring to control adult ticks that are usually located on brush or grass above the soil surface and in mid to late spring to control larvae and nymphs that reside in the soil and leaf litter.

American dog ticks may be a considerable nuisance in suburban settings, particularly where homes are built on land that was previously field or forest. These ticks commonly congregate along paths or roadways where humans are likely to be encountered. Applications should be made as necessary from mid-spring to early fall to control American dog tick larvae, nymphs and adults.

**Note: For large infestations of ants, imported fire ants, and mole crickets, a single application of 0.2 lb ai/acre (40 fluid ounces of Talstar GC Flowable) may be applied once per year.

*Imported Fire Ants: Control will be optimized by combining broadcast applications that will control foraging workers and newly mated thy in queens with mound drenches that will eliminate existing colonies. If the soil is not moist, then it is important to irrigate before application or use a high volume application. Broadcast treatments should apply 0.2 lb ai/A (40 fl. ozs. of Talstar GC Flowable). Mounds should be treated by diluting 1 teaspoon of Talstar GC Flowable per gallon of water and applying 1 to 2 gailons of finished spray per mound. The mounds should be treated with sufficient force to break their apex and allow the insecticide solution to flow into the ant tunnels. A four foot diameter circle around the mound should also be treated. For best results, apply in cool weather (55 - 80°F) or in early morning or late evening hours. Note: a spray rig that is calibrated to apply 0.2 lb ai/A (40 fl. ozs.) of Talstar GC Flowable in 5 gallons per 1.000 square feet contains the approximate dilution (1 teaspoon per gallon) that is required for fire ant mound drenches in the spray tank.

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ORNAMENTALS AND TREES: For ornamental applications, apply 0.125 to 1.0 fluid ounce of Talstar GC Flowable insecticide/miticide per 1,000 sugare feet. Talstar GC Flowable may be diluted and applied in various volumes of water providing that the maximum label rate (1.0 fluid ounce per 1,000 square feet) is not exceeded (refer to Dilution Chart for specific instructions). Talstar GC may be applied through low volume application equipment by dilution with water or other carriers and providing that the maximum label rate (1.0 fluid ounce per 1,000 square feet) is not exceeded.

Pest Control on Outside Surfaces and Around Buildings

For control of Ants, Bees, Biting Flies, Boxelder Bugs, Centipedes, Cockroaches, Crickets, Earwigs, Elm Leaf Beetles, Firebrats, Fleas, Flies, Millipedes, Mosquitoes, Pillbugs, Silverfish, Sowbugs, Spiders, Ticks, and Wasps.

Apply Talstar GC using a 0.03 to 0.06% emulsion as a residual spray to outside surfaces of buildings including, but not limited to, exterior siding, foundations, porches, window frames, eaves, patios, garages, refuse dumps, lawns such as grass areas adjacent or around private homes, duplexes, townhouses, condominiums, house trailers, apartment complexes, carports, garages, fence lines, storage sheds, barns, and other residential and non-commercial structures, soil, trunks of woody ornamentals and other areas where pests congregate or have been seen. Use a spray volume of 2 to 10 gallons of emulsion per 1,000 square feet

Mixing Directions: For 0.03% emulsion, mix 0.5 fluid oz. of Talstar GC per gallon of water. For 0.06% emulsion, mix 1 fluid oz. Talstar GC per gallon of water (1 fluid oz. = 2 tablespoons). Do not use household utensils to measure Talstar GC. Use the higher rate for heavy pest infestation, quicker knockdown or longer residual control. Repeat treatment as necessary to maintain effectiveness.

Perimeter Treatment: Treat a band of soil and vegetation 6 to 10 feet wide around and adjacent to the structure. Also, treat the foundation of the structure to a height of 2 to 3 feet. Apply 0.5 to 1.0 fluid ounces of Talstar per 1,000 square feet in sufficient water to provide adequate)rage (refer to Dilution Chart).

For Ant and Fire Ant Mounds use Talstar GC 0.06% emulsion as Drench Method: Apply 1-2 gallons of emulsion to each mound area by sprinkling the mound until it is wet and treat a 4 foot diameter circle around the mound. Use the higher volume for mounds larger than 12". For best results, apply in cool weather, such as in eady morning or late evening hours, but preferably not in the heat of the day.

For turf treatments apply with ground application equipment only (and apply with nozzles not more than two feet above the grass).

Do not apply when wind conditions favor downwind drift to nearby water bodies.

Do not apply when wind velocity exceeds 10 miles per hour

Avoid application when wind gusts approach 10 mph.
