DIRECTIONS FOR USE OF MARTIN'S 45% CHLORDANE CONCENTRATE

For the control of Japanese Beetle Larvae in Federal and State quarantine programs on ornamental turf (and/or sod) and ornamentals, Use 3 quarts to 5 quarts of Martin's 45% Chlordane per acre and work into the top few inches of the soil. For small areas use 4 to 8 tablespoonsful per 1,000 square feet.

For Control of Subterranean Termites: Use a 1% water emulsion prepared by mixing 8½ quarts to 100 gallons of water or 1 pint to 6 gallons of water. In buildings having basements or crawl spaces, dig a trench along the outside of the foundation walls. In brick or hollow block or concrete foundations, dig a trench to, but not below, the footing. Then as the trench is refilled, treat the soil at the rate of 4 gallons per 10 linear feet for each foot of depth. A trench 3 feet deep would require 12 gallons per 10 linear feet.

The objective is to establish a treated soil barrier which will prevent termite entry. Other critical areas may also require treatment. It is suggested that you consult the State Extension Service for advice.
