

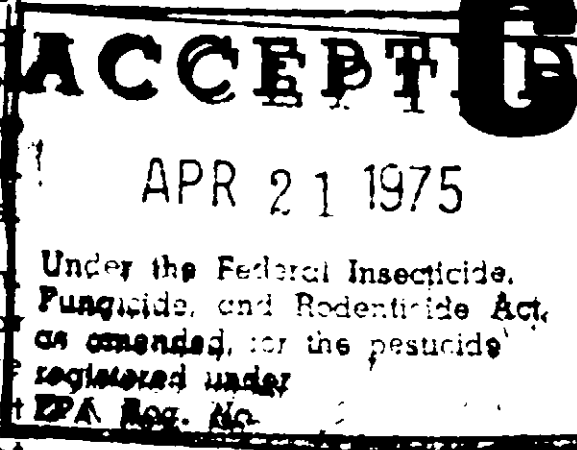

DIRECTIONS

RABON® CATTLE DUST is a ready-to-use insecticide dust which can be applied by hand or through the use of self-treating dust bags. There is no withholding period from last application to slaughter and no withholding period for use of milk.

HAND DUSTING: For the control of horn flies and as an aid in the control of face flies, apply approximately 2 oz. of dust by shaker can, rotary duster or by spoon to the upper portions of the back, neck, and poll, and to the face as an aid in the control of face flies. Rub in lightly to carry the dust beneath the hair. Repeat as necessary.

SELF-TREATING DUST BAG: For the control of horn flies and as an aid in the control of face flies and lice, put dust in cotton cloth or double burlap bags or use prepacked weather-proof cattle dust bags. Hang in barn door exits or alleyways leading from animal buildings, salt or mineral blocks, or watering holes. Protect cloth or burlap bags from weather. Dust bags may be used free of charge in loafing sheds, holding pens, feedlots, near watering holes or other areas where cattle gather. For more information use aids in the control of horn flies.

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
