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**PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS
HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS**

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed. Do not take internally. Avoid eye contact. Flush contaminated eyes with plenty of water and get medical attention if irritation persists. Wash thoroughly after handling. Wash contaminated clothing before re-use. Keep away from food, feedstuffs, and domestic water supplies.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: Active ingredient is a cholinestrase inhibitor. Treat symptomatically. Antropine, by injection only, is an antidote.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If swallowed - Induce vomiting and seek medical attention immediately.

If inhaled - Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.

If in eyes - Flush eyes with plenty of water. Call a physician if irritation persists.

If on skin - Wash skin thoroughly with soap and water.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to birds and wildlife, and extremely toxic to fish and aquatic organisms. Do not apply directly to water. Drift and runoff from treated areas may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in adjacent aquatic sites. Cover or incorporate spills. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Storage: Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Store in original container until used. Keep container tightly closed. Store out of reach of children and domestic animals.

DISPOSAL: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

TO CONTROL TICKS IN THE EAR AND REDUCE REINFESTATION: Treat the inside of the ear thoroughly (about 2 ml.). Repeat application as necessary, but not more often than once every fourteen days (twice per month). Do not apply more than eight times per season or exceed 32 ml (280 mg of chlorpyrifos) per animal per season.

SHAKE WELL BEFORE USING. DO NOT USE ON DAIRY CATTLE. DO NOT TREAT ANIMALS UNDER ONE MONTH OF AGE. DISCONTINUE USE ON SHEEP 35 DAYS BEFORE SLAUGHTER. DISCONTINUE USE ON CATTLE, HORSES, AND GOATS 14 DAYS BEFORE SLAUGHTER. DO NOT USE IN COMBINATION WITH OTHER CHOLINESTERASE-INHIBITING PRODUCTS.

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
