



DIRECTIONS

Point nozzle opening toward area to be sprayed holding bomb about six inches away from area. Release spray by pressing down valve stem and cover area to be treated with light spray. Avoid contact with eyes and mucous membranes. Repeat as needed for effective protection.

For Horse Flies. Spray animal thoroughly and repeat as needed for repellency. To protect animals from stable flies, houseflies, mosquitoes, and gnats, spray areas of animal infested with flies. The legs of horses should especially be treated to protect them from stable flies.
