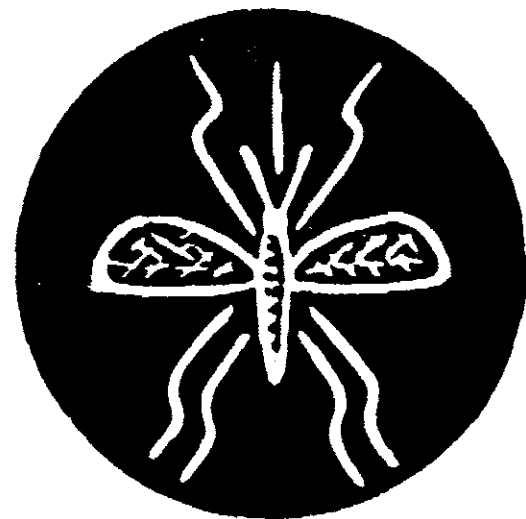

Insect REPELLENT

DIRECTIONS: Remove protective cap, hold can at least 12 inches away and point valve towards area to be treated. A new type valve enables you to hold the can in any position while spraying. Press valve down to release spray. Areas to be treated should be misted lightly. It is not necessary to wet surface. **APPLY TO ALL EXPOSED SKIN AREAS** by first spraying the repellent into the palms of the hands and then shearing evenly on the backs of hands, wrists, ears, neck and face or any other exposed skin. Avoid getting into the eyes and mouth. Reapply as needed.

FOR CLOTHING: Treat shoes, socks and openings in clothing where insects may enter.

WARNING: Do not expose treated surfaces near fire or flame until alcohol has evaporated. Keep spray away from eyes. Harmful if swallowed.

Contents under pressure. Do not puncture or throw container into fire. Exposure to temperatures above 120° F may cause bursting.

KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN

Note: This material is a solvent for lacquer, paint and certain plastic articles. Avoid smearing on goggles, watch crystals, etc. Most asphalt tile, some linoleum, certain plastic materials, fine fabrics and wall papers may tend to soften, discolor or streak when wet with insect repellents. Test on small inconspicuous area before spraying or wetting such articles.
