

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Du Pont ALLY Herbicide is a selective postemergence herbicide recommended for control of grass and broadleaf weeds in wheat, barley, fallow, pasture, and rangeland.

HOW TO USE

In wheat, barley, and fallow where 1/10 oz per acre of ALLY has been applied, the following minimum rotational intervals* can be followed :

	Rotation Interval in Months*	
	ID, OR, WA Soil pH: 6.8 or less and annual rainfall zone: 18" or more**	ID, OR, WA Soil pH >6.8 or annual rainfall zone: <18"
Peas,	10	15
Canola	10	22
Lentils	10	34

*The rotation interval represents the period of time from the last application to the anticipated date of the next planting. Rotation intervals must be extended 1 crop season if drought conditions prevail after application and before the rotational crop is planted, unless a successful field bioassay has been completed (see ALLY label for details.)

**The shorter interval can be used in lower rainfall zones only if supplemental sprinkler irrigation is supplied to the wheat or barley.

Soil pH Limitations

ALLY should not be used on soils having a pH above 7.9. See ALLY label for additional details on tank mixtures, application methods, weeds controlled, other rotational crop restrictions, and general precautions.

Restrictions


• Wherever ALLY is used on land previously treated with Glean® FC, Finesse®, Amber¹, Assert², or other longer residual herbicides with the same mode of action, read the rotational guidelines on both labels and follow the one with the longest interval stated for your situation before choosing to rotate to crops other than wheat or barley.

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
