DESCRIPTION: This preservative solution may be used as a priming coat on bare wood and provides maximum preservative protection to many interior and exterior wood surfaces. Wood surfaces treated with CUPROCURE GREEN will repel wood decaying fungi and wood destroying insects including termites and teredos.

DIRECTIONS: We recommend two liberal coats. This material can be brushed, sprayed or dipped as desired. If dipped, allow 3 minutes immersion per inch thickness of wood in contact with soil. Pettit CUPROCURE GREEN requires no thinning.

DESCRIPTION

This is a heavy bodied green paint which is used for the protection of steel structures from corrosion. It is applied by brush or spray. It is not recommended for use on aluminum or galvanized steel.

Apply a heavy coat of paint to the surface to be protected. It is recommended that the surface be clean and free of oil and grease. It is also recommended that the surface be dry.
