

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

For application to either moist or dry follage anytime dusting conditions are favorable. Application should begin when plants are small; increase dosage as plants grow larger. Dusters should be adjusted to give uniform and thorough coverage.

RECOMMENDED USES

BEANS (Dry, Lima and String): For control of downy mildew, powdery mildew, Anthracnose, and angular leaf spot, apply 15 to 35 lbs. per acre when mildew first appears and repeat at weekly intervals. Do not apply within 4 days of harvest.

CARROTS: For control of Cercospora leaf spot, Alternaria leaf blight, early blight, late blight and leaf spot, apply 15 to 45 lbs. per acre when diseases are reported in the area and repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals during the growing season or as required for adequate control.

CtLERY: For control of early and late blight and leaf spot, apply 15 to 45 lbs. per acre when plants first come through ground. Repeat 7 to 10 day intervals, until plants are set in field. Continue field applications on weekly schedule. Remove excess residues by stripping, trimming, washing or other effective means before marketing.

EGGPLANTS, PEPPERS, AND POTATIOES: For control of Anthracnose, and Cercosporae, early blight, late blight and leaf spot on Peppers: Phomopsis, early blight (alternaria) and anthracnose, early blight, late blight and leaf spot on Eggplants; early blight (Alternaria and late blight (Phytophthora) on potatoes, apply 25 to 45 lbs. per acre. Begin application when plants are transplanted to the field or before diseases are expected to appear, and repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals.

ONIONS: For control of downy mildew, botrytis leaf blight and purple blotch leaf blight and purple blotch, apply 25 to 50 lbs. per acre beginning when plants reach the 4 leaf stage or when disease conditions are reported in the area and repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals during season.

SPINACH: For contrl of downy mildew (blue mold), apply 25 to 45 lbs. per acre at first signs of mildew and repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals or as required. Do not apply within 7 days of harvest and remove excess residues by washing.

TOMATOES: For control of early and late blight, Anthracnose, Stemphylium (grey leaf spot) and Septoria leaf spots, apply 25 to 50 lbs. per acre when disease is first reported in area and repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals or oftener under severe late blight conditions. Wash and carefully wipe all fresh fruit before marketing.

Do not use on Cucurbits or other plants susceptible to sulfur injury. Store in a cool, dry place. Keep container closed when not in use. Harmful if swallowed. Copper 5% dust retains toxicity for a long period of time when exposed to weathering action. This product is toxic to fungus diseases, but will not injure fruit or vegetables when used at recommended dosages.
