STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

CAUTION

This product is toxic to fish, birds and other wildlife. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of waste.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Do not reuse bag. Discard bag in trash.

Applicators must wear the following protective clothing during the application process; long-sleeved shirt, long pants. Wear a disposable dust mask covering 1/3 of face or more.

GLADIOLUS--

Dust twice a week from early stages until spikes begin to open for control of the following insects and diseases: Thrips, Botrytis, Curvularia, Stemphylium. Repeat as necessary. Continue dusting every 7 to 10 days as long as insects are present.

SPECIAL STORAGE CARE FOR GLADIOLUS

Apply dust to bulbs after they are cleaned (as you put them in storage).

ALSO RECOMMENDED FOR USE ON THESE:

Azaleas, Camellias: To control Petal Blight, apply as least twice a week while flowers are opening. Also apply to soil and litter around the plants while the flowers are in bloom. Repeat every 7 to 10 days for insect control.

Carnations, Chrysanthemums, Hollyhocks, Snapdragons: To control rust, Leaf Spot, and Anthracnose, apply as soon as disease threatens. Repeat every 7 to 10 days or as often as necessary to keep new foliage protected.

Roses: For control of Black Spot, dust at 7 to 10 day intervals and after every rain. For best results, apply before plants become affected.
