

DIRECTIONS

FOR THE CONTROL OF GARDEN INSECTS — For use on roses, dahlias, and asters to kill Japanese beetles, aphids, exposed thrips and spider mites. Hold container at least 18" from foliage, spray lightly in one-second bursts spraying both top and underside of foliage. Properly treated foliage will be protected for about one week.

This spray may be used on African violets, asters, azaleas, begonias, camellias, carnations, chrysanthemums, dahlias, delphiniums, dogwood, English ivy, euonymus, fuchsia, geraniums, crassula, grape vine, Kentia palm, laurel, marigolds, rhododendrons, roses, rubber plants, snap dragons, stocks, Wandering Jew and zinnias.

As a fungicide, spray before infection occurs for the prevention of powdery mildew and black spot on roses. Spray at five to seven day intervals while danger of fungus infestation persists.

CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed or inhaled. Avoid breathing spray or contact with eyes or skin. Wash thoroughly after use. Avoid contamination of feed or foodstuffs. Do not spray closer than 18 inches from plants. Do not use near fishbowls or aquaria.

- No. 1: Deletion of the phases "incipient insect infestations", "other ornamentals", "many garden insects", and "such plants as".
- No. 2: Addition of the caution "This product is toxic to fish. Keep out of lakes, streams, or ponds. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment, or disposal of waste. Apply this product only as specified on this label."
- No. 3: Change "and fungicide" to "with a fungicide".
- No. 4: Deletion of hyphen after Folpet. Addition of parenthesis to chemical name.
- No. 5: Addition of proper wording to container
