BACKRUBBER INSECTICIDE

DIRECTIONS

Thoroughly mix BRICON at the rate of 1 pint to 5 gallons of fuel oil, diesel fuel or light mineral oil. **DO NOT** mix with used motor oil as it may contain ingredients harmful to cattle. In extremely hot weather the efficacy of backrubbers is increased by more frequent treatment and the use of a heavier oil (2 parts of diesel fuel mixed with 1 part of medium paraffin base motor oil is suggested). Apply diluted material slowly to the backrubber so it will be thoroughly saturated using about 1 gallon for a 20 foot backrubber.

Backrubbers should be re-treated at 2 week intervals OR AS NEEDED. Set up and charge backrubbers early in the season for more effective control.

For control of horn flies, locate backrubbers at spots where cattle habitually congregate, but away from trees or brush. Locations near watering places, salt licks or feed troughs are ideal. Use one unit for each 50 to 75 head of cattle, so they may be used as needed.

To aid in the control of lice, backrubbers should be used that permit cattle to contact their legs and undersides where lice congregate with the insecticide. Seasonal relocation of backrubbers to sites where cattle congregate is essential to permit frequent use.

To aid in control of face flies, use backrubbers that are equipped with hanging burlap sacks to permit cattle to get the insecticide on their faces, heads and necks.
