I M P O R T A N T

Baiting should continue as long as evidence of feeding is observed. Except in extremely heavy infestations this should be from five days to two weeks. Where a continuous source of infestation is present from nearby dumps or fields, permanent bait stations should be used and bait placed in them as often as necessary.

Place baits in locations not accessible to children.

C A U T I O N

Warfarin Concentrate contains as its active ingredient an anti-coagulant chemical therefore baits prepared with Warfarin Concentrate must be protected from or placed where humans, livestock, poultry or pets will not eat them. In case baits are eaten, give a tablespoonful of salt in a glass of warm water and repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Call a physician immediately.

KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN

NOTE FOR PHYSICIANS: When a human has been known to have ingested any Warfarin Concentrate, blood transfusions combined with intravenous injections and oral doses of Vitamin K are indicated as in the case of hemorrhage caused by overdoses of Dicumarol*.
