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DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

ROACHES: Use powder containing 0.9% ~~pyrethrins~~ higher. Treat cracks and

ROACHES: Use powder containing 0.9% pyrethrins or higher. Treat cracks and crevices in woodwork, dark spaces behind pipes and all places which roaches infest, hitting as many insects as possible and repeating whenever reinfestation occurs.

FLEAS and TICKS on PREMISES: Follow directions for roaches.

FLEAS, TICKS and LICE on ANIMALS: Use powder containing 0.9% pyrethrins directly on infested animals.

CRANBERRY GIRDLER: Apply powder containing 1.2% pyrethrins at the rate of 50 lbs. per acre once every 5 to 7 days depending on infestation.

BLUNT-NOSED LEAFHOPPER: Apply powder containing 0.9% pyrethrins at the rate of 50 lbs. per acre once every 5 to 7 days depending on infestation.

MUSHROOM FLIES: Apply powder containing 0.5% pyrethrins once every 5 to 7 days. Quantity for adequate coverage depends upon size of mushroom house.

STRAWBERRY LEAF ROLLER AND FLEA BEETLE: Apply powder containing 0.9% pyrethrins at the rate of 30 to 50 lbs. per acre once a week depending upon extent of infestation.
