**TO KILL HOUSEHOLD PESTS**

**FOR FLYING INSECTS:** To kill houseflies, mosquitoes, gnats. Close all doors and windows. Point nozzle spray mist to all parts of the room especially windows, sources which attract these insects. Fill room with treated areas. Keep the room closed for at least 15 minutes room when treatment is completed.

**TO KILL WASPS:** Applications should be made in late insects are at rest. Spray liberally into hiding and contacting as many insects as possible. Repeat directly on stray wasps that enter buildings.

**FOR CRAWLING INSECTS:** To kill roaches, silverfish, sowbugs. Hold dispenser about 12 inches from sprayed. Spray thoroughly into hiding places such as moist areas, openings around pipes and sinks, baseboards and storage areas. Spray directly on possible.

**SPIDERS:** Spray thoroughly at spiders and webbing and crevices which harbor these pests. Repeat as necessary.  
**CARPET BEETLES:** Spray top and underside as necessary.

**ANTS:** Spray trails, nests, doors and window frames where possible. Repeat as necessary.

**TO KILL BEDBUGS AND LICE:** Apply as a spot treatment to cracks and crevices around baseboards, floorboards, bedboards and walls. First, thoroughly clean and air mattresses and springs. Then spot treat only areas that may harbor pests, concentrating on tufts, folds, and seams. Repeat as necessary. For persistent infestations, consult professional applicator.

**TO KILL PESTS & PROTECT ORNAMENTAL PLANTS  
(Listed on Front Panel)**

Spray garden plants when air is still and temperature is low. Spray with a slow sweeping motion about 36 inches up. Avoid wetting - a light spray kills pests effectively. Repeat application from time to time as long as insects. Use with caution on tender foliage, young plants and for adult White Flies and Spider Mites be sure to direct at these pests. Thoroughly cover the infested area. Repeat as necessary.
