DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Alfalfa: For control of alfalfa weevil, spittlebug, leafhopper and aphid.

First cutting: Apply 2 - 3 quarts per acre as soon as weevil damage appears in the field. Early application is desired to control the weevil when they are small. Do not apply within 7 days of harvest. Do not apply after full bloom.

Stubble spraying: In areas where weevil appears at cutting time. Remove the first cutting and apply 2 - 3 quarts per acre to the stubble to control weevil larvae and aphid.

Second and subsequent cuttings: Apply 2 - 3 quarts per acre to control alfalfa weevil, leafhopper and aphid as these insects appear.

CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed. Avoid prolonged breathing of spray mist. Avoid prolonged or repeated contact with skin. Wash thoroughly after using. Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs.
