DURSBAN[®] 1/2 G GRANULAR INSECTICIDE

Controls Chinch Bugs, Sod Webworms (Lawn Moths), Ants, Brown Dog Ticks, Crickets, Cutworms, Earwigs, Sowbugs (Pillbugs) Certain White Grubs and Hyperodes (Turfgrass) Weevils Infesting Home Lawns and Other Ornamental Turf Areas

ACTIVE INGREDIENT:

Chlorpyrifos (O,O-diethyl O-(3,5,6-trichloro-2-pyridyl) phosphorothioate) 0.5%

INERT INGREDIENTS: 99.5%

USE DIRECTIONS

Apply DURSBAN 1/2 G granular insecticide uniformly to home lawns and other ornamental and recreational turf grass areas using any hand or power operated gravity or rotary type spreader designed for application of granular materials. Treat when insects first appear using DURSBAN 1/2 G at the rate of 200 pounds per acre. To help obtain uniform distribution, apply one-half the required amount of product in one direction; then apply the balance at a right angle. Immediately after application sprinkle the turf with 1300 gallons of water per acre so as to wash the granules into the zone of insect infestation. Consult the following table to determine amounts of DURSBAN 1/2 G and water needed for smaller sized areas. Re-treat as necessary.

RATES TO USE

Area to be Treated	Pounds of DURSBAN 1/2 G	Gallons of Water to Sprinkle on Turf after Treatment
1000 sq. ft.	5	30
5000 sq. ft.	25	150
10700 sq. ft.	50	325

To control certain white grubs (larvae of European chafer and Japanese beetle) use two to four times the amounts of DURSBAN 1/2 G shown in the table, i.e. 10 to 20 pounds per 1,000 sq. ft. Apply the granules uniformly over the area treated followed immediately by thorough watering to wash the insecticide into the turf. For best results treat when grubs are young and actively feeding near the soil surface, usually during late July and August. Consult your local Agricultural Extension Service specialist for proper time to treat in your area.

To control Hyperodes (turfgrass) weevils use twice the rate of DURSBAN 1/2 G shown in the table. Treat suspected problem areas in mid April and again in mid May. Consult your local Agricultural Extension Service specialist for best time to treat in your area.

USE PRECAUTIONS

Keep children and pets off treated areas until this material is washed into the soil and grass is dry. This product is toxic to fish, birds and other wildlife. Keep out of any body of water. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes. Apply this product only as specified on this label.

Dispose of empty container and wastes by burning or by burying in non-croplands away from domestic water supplies.
