

TO REFILL DUST GUN

insert coin in groove at edge and pry off this lid. Refill gun with more Henry Field dust, then replace lid tightly.

TO USE THIS HANDY GUN:

1. Twist tube to break label at perforation.
2. Remove seal which covers hole at top of gun.
3. Use pumping stroke to spray Rose Dust.



TREATMENT OF BULBS (when planting)

For use on Tulips, Daffodils, Hyacinths, Gladiolus, Narcissus and Crocus.

As an aid in the control of Thrip, Botrytis, Bulb and Root Rot, and Fusarium Rot. Before planting, dust the bulbs lightly, coating them with whatever dust will stick to them. Plant immediately. Cover the bulbs with several inches of soil, then sprinkle the soil with dust. After filling the bulb hole to ground level, coat the soil again with dust and rake the dust into the soil.

GLADIOLUS

Dust twice a week from early stages until spikes begin to open for control of the following insects and diseases: Thrip, Botrytis, Curvularia, Stemphylium leaf spot. Repeat as necessary. Continue dusting every 7 to 10 days as long as insects are present.

SPECIAL STORAGE CARE FOR GLADIOLUS

For control of Thrip on the stored corm, apply dust to Gladiolus bulbs or corms after they are cleaned (as you put them in storage) by placing a few bulbs in a strong paper bag, dust a tablespoon of dust on the bulbs, close the bag opening and shake vigorously.

ALSO RECOMMENDED FOR USE ON THESE:

Azaleas, Camellias: To control Petal Blight, apply dust 2 to 3 times a week while flowers are opening. Apply dust also to the soil and litter around the plants while they are in bloom.

Carnations, Chrysanthemums, Hollyhocks, Snapdragons: To control Rust, Leaf Spot, and Anthracnose, apply as soon as disease threatens. Repeat every 7 to 10 days or as often as necessary to keep new foliage protected.

CAUTION



TREATMENT OF BULBS (when planting)

For use on Tulips, Daffodils, Hyacinths, Gladiolus, Narcissus and Crocus.

Apply to the roots of Tulip, Belladonna, Bulb and Root Rot, and Fungus Rot before planting. Dust the bulbs lightly, coating them with white dust as you take them from the cardboard. Cover the bulb with a thin layer of soil, then spray the bulb with dust. After filling the bulb, coat the bulb with dust and seal with dust and safe the dust in the

GLADIOLUS

For use on a wide range of bulb and corm diseases, including bulb and corm rot, stem rot, and stem blight. Apply to the roots of the bulb or corm. Repeat every 7 to 10 days until the plants are protected.

**SPECIAL STORAGE CARE
FOR GLADIOLUS**

For control of Fungus on the roots, coat the roots with dust before planting. After planting, coat the roots with dust by planting a few bulbs in a trench, applying dust to the roots, dust on the bulbs, close the trench, and make up the soil.

ALSO RECOMMENDED FOR USE ON THESE:

Azaleas, Camellias: To control Fungus Blight and other diseases, apply a week after flowers are open. Apply dust to the roots and to the leaves of the plant while they are in bloom.

Carnations, Chrysanthemums, Hollyhocks, Snapdragons: For control of Root Rot, Leaf Spot, and Anthracnose, apply dust to the roots of the plants. Repeat every 7 to 10 days until the plants are protected.
