APPLICATION:

Application can be made by means of bucket sprayers or power sprayers. Spray the liquid uniformly over the surface of the material. GRAINFUME MB quickly vaporizes, forming a heavy vapor which kills the insects as it settles through the seed or grain. The optimum grain temperature for fumigating is between 65° to 75° F. Use GRAINFUME MB at a dosage of 1½ gallons per 1000 bushels of stored material. It is usual to make application as the grain or seed is being turned from one bin to another. In that way the ingoing material will carry the fumigant along and distribute it uniformly throughout the bin. Material going into the top and bottom of the bin should receive a double dosage. The exposure period is one week. After exposure, the enclosures should be aerated for at last 24 hours. Fumigation should be undertaken only on storage facilities capable of retaining the vapors for the required exposure period. Stored grain or seed should be inspected at least once a month. If evidence of insect damage shows up, fumigate promptly.
