# STAPHEX

## EMULSION MOP TREATMENT

**ACTIVE INGREDIENT:**

N-Alkyl (60% C-14, 30% C-16, 5% C-12, 5% C-18)  
 dimethyl benzyl ammonium chloride..... 0.2%  
 N-Alkyl (50% C-12, 30% C-14, 17% C-16, 3% C-18)  
 dimethyl ethylbenzyl ammonium chlorides..... 0.2%

**INERT INGREDIENTS:**..... 99.6%

Aids in the control of bacteria and fungi growth on mops. Reduces dustborne bacteria and fungi by controlling dust. Will render mop germproof.

**DIRECTIONS**

Rinse mop free of soap or anionic detergents before applying STAPHEX.

For the daily maintenance of all floors, spray on dust mops at the rate of one ounce for each four inches of mop width. Let mop stand overnight before using. As an alternate method, mops may be immersed in STAPHEX solution. For thorough saturation, wring out and let dry overnight at room temperature before using. Use treated mops in regular sweeping operation. Recommended for use on waxed-composition and all other floors.

Soiled mops treated with STAPHEX launder easily. Rinse out in warm water. Add slight amount detergent to wash water if mops are heavily soiled.

**CAUTION:** Harmful if swallowed. Should not come in contact with food. Avoid getting concentrate in eyes. In case of contact, wash thoroughly with water. If irritation persists, get medical attention.
