DIRECTIONS

Remove metal cap. Hold dispenser 3 to 6 inches from surface. Aim nozzle at infested area and press valve to release spray. Move across surface at rate of 1 or 2 ft. per second, leaving wet coating. Spray beneath cracks, storage areas, other hiding places. Spray ant trails, areas around door trim and window frames, also damp spots and wall coverings. Repeat as needed. For Surface Use Only. Do Not Spray into the Air.

ROACH AND ANT SPRAY

ROACHES, WATERBUGS, SILVERFISH, SPIDERS, CRICKETS: Spray heavily into all cracks, around baseboards and other places where these insects hide. Also spray wall and surfaces behind and beneath cabinets, refrigerators, sinks, stoves, etc. Spray other localized areas infested with these pests. Repeat treatment as required.

CARPET BEETLES: Make localized application to areas of the floor and baseboards. Spray directly into cracks, and under carpets where insects may be found. Treat crevices, cracks, or closets and infested areas of shelves. Repeat as necessary.

BROWN DOG TICKS: Thoroughly spray infested areas around baseboards, windows and door frames, wall cracks, sleeping quarters of household pets, and localized areas of floors and floor coverings. Application should be repeated as infestations warrant, and re-infestations occur. Fresh bedding should be placed in animal quarters following treatment. Do not treat animals with this formulation.

FLIES, MOSQUITOES, WASPS AND FLYING MOTHS OUTDOORS: For outdoor use only as an aid in reducing annoyance from these insects. Spray outside surfaces of screen doors, window frames or wherever these insects may enter the room. Also treat surfaces around light fixtures on porches, in garages, and other places where these insects alight or congregate.

FLEAS, CHIGGERS, ANTS AND BROWN DOG TICKS OUTDOORS: For treatment of localized infestations of these insects in outdoor areas where there is no vegetation, spray infested areas thoroughly. For ants, thoroughly wet hills and runways. Repeat applications as infestations warrant and as re-infestations occur.

WARNING: Harmful if swallowed. Keep out of reach of children. Avoid prolonged inhalation and skin contact. Wash thoroughly after using. Do not use on household pets or humans. Do not use near fire or open flame. Keep container tightly closed. Avoid contamination of food and foodstuffs.

Do not use in the edible product areas of food processing plants, restaurants or other areas where food is commercially prepared or processed. Do not use in serving areas while food is exposed.

CAUTION: Contents Under Pressure. Do not use or store near heat or open flame or where temperature exceeds 130°F. Asphalt tile, some linoleum, certain plastic materials and wallpapers may tend to discolor, streak or soften when wet with insecticides. Test on small inconspicuous area before spraying or wetting such materials.

STORAGE: Store in a cool, dry area away from heat or open flame.

DISPOSAL: Replace cap. Securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash. Do not incinerate or puncture.

Your Application Dated February 3, 1984

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable. A stamped copy is enclosed for your records.

The following revisions should be made at the next label printing.

1. Refer to the enclosed guide to the labeling requirements of FIFRA for assistance in adding the required headings and text additions. Necessary items to be added have been highlighted on the enclosure.
2. The claim formulated for hospitals, etc., appears to have been added on labeling for the additional brand name Spraypak Roach and Bug Killer in April 1969, but did not appear on the master brand name label of record, "Chase's Roach, Bug and Ant Killer." While there is no objection to the use sites claimed, the use in hospitals requires a precaution not to use in occupied patients' rooms because of the cholinesterase inhibition mode of action of the product's active ingredient, diazinon.
3. Future submissions for label revision must bear the master product name, Chase's Roach, Bug and Ant Killer. If you wish to change the official master name to Spraypak Roach and Bug Killer Insecticide as indicated on your latest label submission and cover letter, please file a formal amendment to change the master product name.
