

DIRECTIONS: Use one 6-oz. Formula No. 105 for each 100 cu. ft. of water. Turn faucet on and allow to run, stirring frequently until all ingredients are dissolved. Clean glass and equipment before use.

Abnormalities must be removed from the bone or cartilage before it can be attacked and absorbed. The deeper cartilage, the older the lesion, may undergo calcification and become a hard, non-vital, bony deposit. This is an example of the process of ossification. The new bone is placed in the cavity which has been formed by the absorption of the old tissue. This is called secondary ossification. The new bone may be formed by the removal of old bone, or it may be formed by the addition of new bone. To prevent the possible threat to the body, the body is provided with numerous self-regulating mechanisms. These include the control of bone growth, the control of bone resorption, and the control of bone remodeling.

It is the first time that I have seen a specimen of this species, and it is very similar to the one described by Gmelin.

Percent Treatment: Ages 11-15
