Wasp and Hornet Spray

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Wind should always be at back of user, and blowing towards object being sprayed. For optimum performance, if spraying overhead, line actuator spout with mark on valve cup. If spraying down, line actuator spout to be directly opposite mark on valve cup.

WASPS AND HORNETS: Hold container in upright position to spray. Stand safe distance, 6-12 feet from nest and not directly underneath. Align actuator opening toward mark on valve cup. Aim actuator opening at nest with wind at your back. Spray until nest is thoroughly wet. Hit wasp and hornets on nest when possible. Best time to spray is in early morning or in evening, since wasps and hornets congregate on or in nest at night. Do not apply to pets or contaminate food, foodstuffs, dishes or utensils. Avoid spraying plants foliage as injury may occur. For outdoor use only. Not a space spray.

To prevent dying insects from falling on skin and clothing, do not stand directly under nest being sprayed.

YELLOW JACKETS AND BEES: Locate underground nest. Align actuator opening away from mark on valve cup. Depress actuator and spray, with a sweeping motion, any stimulated or stirred up insects around nest opening. Afterwards, move forward to nest opening and spray liquid from 6 to 8 seconds directly into nest hole. This will suffocate bees in nest; other bees trying to return to nest will be repelled and will fly around and away harmlessly.

SPIDERS, INCLUDING BLACK WIDOW AND BROWN RECLUSE: Spray directly on spiders and web.
