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## MO-GO DIRECTIONS

TAT Mo-go Mole and Gopher Killer is the best known specific for these ground burrowing pests.
Lawn Protection from Moles-If many runs prevail, roll the turf. When new runs appear insert a pointed stick into the run at intervals of about four feet. Drop a few Mo-go pellets into each opening and close the opening by pulling turf together. Avoid covering bait with dirt.
Buib Protection from Moles-To protect fall planted bulbs against destruction by moles, pack about one-quarter inch of soil against each buib and then place several Mo-go pellets against the soil at the side of the bulb, not underneath. Moles will eat Mo-go and be destroyed.
Pocket Gophers-Where gophers appear, small mounds of dirt will show where the opening is but the main run may be some distance away, eight to eighteen inches and usually at right
 angles to the branch tunnel which runs into the mound. Use pointed stick to probe for the main tunnel. When located, immediately drop in several Mo-go pellets as stick is removed and plug at once with small stone or bunch of grass. Treat two or three mounds at each end of main tunnels. Scrape other levels. Repeat if new mounds appear.
