Your Letters Dated October 14 and November 12, 1987

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under section 3(c)(7)(A) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable provided that you:

1. Submit/cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 3(c)(5) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
2. Submit five (5) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.
3. Before releasing this product, submit the following information:
  - a. A revised Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF) showing the correct amount of sumithrin. The CSF you submitted shows a lower certified limit of 0.191 percent. By our calculations the amount should be 0.200 percent. It is suggested that quantities reflecting actual amounts used in making batches of this product be given in Column 13. If this product is actually made in 1000 lb batches, the total at the bottom of Column 13 should be 1000.
  - b. Submit a new data matrix to go with the revised CSF.

#### DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

##### General Classification

Read entire label and use strictly in accordance with label cautions, warnings and directions. It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL:

Store in a cool dry area away from heat or open flame. Do not reuse empty container. After use, wrap container and put in trash collection.

#### IMPORTANT FOR PROPER USE

Use one can for each 6,000 cubic feet (an area 30' x 25' x 8') of unobstructed area. Use additional units for remote rooms or where free flow of mist is not assured.

This product will kill Fleas, Houseflies, Mosquitoes, Ticks, Spiders, Ants and Small Flying Moths.

Aids in control of Roaches.

Place can in center of area to be fogged. Unfold several layers of newspaper and place can in middle of paper on floor. Open cabinets and doors to area to be treated and fogged. **REMOVE PETS.** Cover fish tanks or bowls and shut off aerators. Shut off fans and air conditioners. Put out all open flames and pilot lights. Close doors and windows. Keep at arms length when releasing. Point can away from face when releasing.

To Kill Ticks: Remove and destroy pet's old bedding. Use product as above. Treat dogs and cats with registered tick control product prior to re-entry.

To Kill Fleas: Follow directions for ticks but use one unit per 1,500 cubic feet of room space.

Heavy flea infestation may necessitate repeat fogging in 8-10 days to kill newly hatched fleas or as necessary. Repeat fogging for ticks may also be necessary.

**TO START FOGGING:** Push down securely on valve actuator and force valve into locked position. Place can in upright position in middle of newspaper and leave area at once. Leave undisturbed for at least four hours. Then open doors and windows and allow to air for 30 minutes.

#### PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS Hazardous to Humans and Domestic Animals

### CAUTION:

Harmful if swallowed. Avoid inhalation of vapors. Avoid contact with skin, eyes or clothing. Wash contaminated skin properly with soap and warm water. For eyes, flush with plenty of water. Get Medical attention if irritation persists. Avoid contamination of food and feedstuffs.

Do not use in commercial food processing, handling, serving, storage or preparation area. In the home all food processing surfaces and utensils should be covered during treatment or thoroughly washed before use. Cover exposed food. **KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN.**

Remove pets, birds and cover fish aquariums before spraying.

#### PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

Solvents may soften some finished surfaces. Soak up the Drape newspaper over any item to avoid possible marking of finish like waxed wood floors and waxed furniture. Some plastic items may be affected by the solvent and if questionable cover with paper.

Contents under pressure. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperature above 130 F may cause bursting.
