- 100 use when seeding new lawns in April, May or early June. Sow seed first, then rake lightly to mix seed into upper 1/2 inch of soil. Next spread this product and water with a gentle spray.
- 100 use when seeding into thin lawns. Sow seeds first, anytime weather conditions in early spring permit if cold weather will not harm seed. Apply this product at a later time, between the first and fifth mowing of the grass, before dandelions are in the pull-off stage. This will still be early enough to prevent crabgrass development. Make a follow-up application one month later. Water immediately after application with a gentle spray to thoroughly moisten the soil.
- 100 apply at Scotts Spreader (Standard or Automatic Model) setting 6 (Treats 5,000 sq ft).
- 100 overlap spreader wheel tracks for complete coverage.
- 100 use on lawns of renergrass, bermudagrass, or zoysia on ondichondra and similar grass covers.
- 100 use on lawns of renergrass, bermudagrass, or zoysia on ondichondra and similar grass covers. Take or aerify after application so as to disturb the chemical barrier in the soil surface.
- 100 use this product to control crabgrass, other wild grasses, already up and growing.
- 100 use this product to prevent or control dandelions, plantain, or chickweed.
