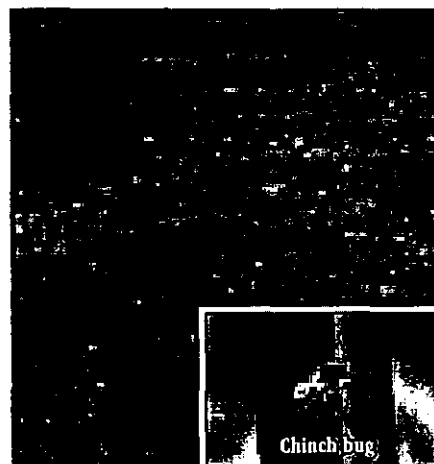

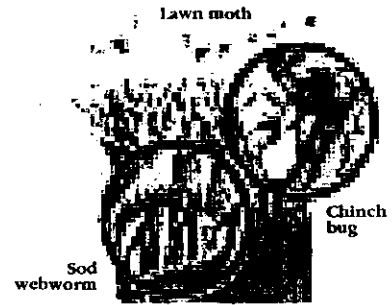

## KEY PRODUCT FACTS

### Directions for Use

- It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.
- Apply product to entire lawn when insect activity or damage (chewed or browned leaves) is first observed in the lawn.
  - Apply product to a dry lawn.
  - Water-in product after application. Don't allow traffic on the lawn until it has dried.
  - Do not use any other weed or disease control products for at least one week after application.
  - For severe insect problems, a second application may be needed in 6 weeks.
  - Do not use on fruit or vegetable plants.
  - FOR FIRE ANTS** (except in California)
    - Apply 1/2 cup of product on each fire ant mound.
    - Water gently and thoroughly after application.
    - For best results, apply in early morning or late evening.
  - FOR CHINCH BUGS**
    - Start treatments when daily high temperatures are 80°F or above and repeat at 6 week intervals if insect activity continues.
  - FOR MOLE CRICKETS**
    - Water your lawn first, let lawn dry, and then apply product.
    - Water-in product thoroughly. Apply in May to July, when insects are young.
  - FOR CRANE FLY LARVAE** (leatherjackets)
    - Apply when activity is first noticed in the spring, usually mid-March to mid-April.

### Special Precautions to Reduce Risks to Birds

- Birds, especially waterfowl (ducks or geese), feeding or drinking on treated areas may be killed. To reduce risks to birds:
- Do not treat areas larger than 15,000 sq. ft.
  - Because of the migratory habits of certain waterfowl, do not apply in Nassau County, New York, between November 1 and May 20.
  - Do not exceed maximum permitted label rates, since rates above those recommended significantly increase potential hazards to birds, especially waterfowl.
  - Avoid overlapping treated areas.
  - Follow all watering instructions included within the directions for use, however, stop watering before puddling occurs.
  - Do not apply this product to sites occupied by waterfowl or to sites within 75 feet of any body of water that may attract waterfowl, such as lakes or ponds.
  - If necessary to repeat application, wait a minimum of 3 weeks before applications. Make no more than 4 applications per year.

#### Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals

**CAUTION:** Harmful if swallowed, inhaled, or absorbed through skin. Avoid breathing dust and contact with eyes, skin, or clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling and before smoking or eating. Do not store near food or feed. Do not contaminate ornamental fish ponds. Do not allow children or pets onto the treated area until granules have been watered in and the grass or soil has dried.

#### First Aid

**If swallowed:** Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching the back of the throat with finger. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth if person is unconscious or convulsing.

**If inhaled:** Remove victim to fresh air and apply artificial respiration if indicated.

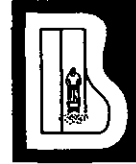
**If on skin:** Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with soap and water.

**If in eyes:** Rinse eyes with plenty of water and call a physician immediately.

**Note to Physicians:** This product contains an organophosphate insecticide. If symptoms of cholinesterase inhibition are present, atropine sulfate by injection is antidotal. 2-PAM is also antidotal and may be administered, but only in conjunction with atropine.

### Spreading Tips

Apply product in the longest direction of lawn.



### Spreader Settings

For best results, use Scotts broadcast spreader on lawn before applying product.

#### Scotts Rotary Spreaders

Scotts SpeedyGreen® 4 Make each pass about 5 feet from previous pass to overlap spread width.

Scotts EasyGreen® 25 Make each pass about 20 feet from previous pass to overlap spread width.

#### Scotts Drop Spreaders

Scotts AccuGreen® 5 1/2 Make sure spreader wheel completely overlaps previous spread mark.

Scotts PrecisionGreen® 6 3/4 Make sure spreader wheel completely overlaps previous spread mark.

### Environmental Hazards

This pesticide is highly toxic to birds, fish, and other wildlife. Birds, especially waterfowl, feeding or drinking on treated areas may be killed. Because of the migratory habits of certain Atlantic Coast waterfowl, do not apply this product to lawns in Nassau County, New York, between November 1 and May 20. Do not exceed maximum permitted label rates, since application rates above those recommended significantly increase potential hazards to birds and waterfowl. Avoid overlapping of granules. Where irrigation (watering) is recommended in the directions, or if waterfowl, i.e., ducks or geese, can be expected in the treated area after treatment (except spot treatment), water lawn with at least 1/4 inch of water immediately after applying this product, however, stop watering before puddling occurs. Keep out of lakes, streams, ponds, tidal marshes and estuaries. Do not apply directly to water. Runoff may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in neighboring areas. Shrimp and crab may be killed at application rates recommended on this label. Do not apply where fish, shrimp, crab, and other aquatic life are important resources. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of equipment washwaters.

### Storage and Disposal

**STORAGE:** Store in original container in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area inaccessible to children and domestic animals. Do not store near fertilizers, herbicides, seeds, food, or feed. Reseal opened bag by folding top down and securing.

**PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.
