The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, is acceptable provided that you:

1. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

a. Specify Directions for Use.

Immediately below add:

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

b. Above CAUTION on the left panel add the headings:

Precautionary Statements

Hazards to Humans (and Domestic Animals)

c. Align the percentages of active ingredients on the same margin.

- d. Above "This product is toxic to fish and wildlife" add the heading:

- e. Modify "Keep out of lakes, streams, or ponds" to read:

Do not apply directly to water or wetlands.

- f. You can delete "Apply this product only as specified on this label" and "Do not re-use container. Destroy when empty."

- g. On the front panel add the referral statement:

See side panel for additional precautionary statements.

- 2. Submit one (1) copy of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

A stamped copy of the labeling is enclosed for your records.

The amended formula and labeling supersedes any previously accepted ones.

DIRECTIONS

Apply any time of year except when ground is frozen. Best results are obtained late in spring or early summer. Before treating calibrate equipment to insure uniform coverage. Apply as directed. Use power sprayers, compressed air hand sprayers, knapsack sprayers, or sprinkler can. No agitation or dilution is required. The concentrate may be used as is, without further mixing, or may be diluted with oil or with water before applying. Each gallon of DEVOID concentrate may be diluted with up to 10 gallons of diesel oil or fuel oil or water. Use fuel oil where there is no danger of fire. However, where fire is a concern, or where ground is very dry, use water.

TO CONTROL ANNUAL WEEDS AND GRASSES such as foxtail, ryegrass, wild oats, crabgrass, bromegrass, ragweed, lambsquarter, puncturevine and turkey mullein: Apply 1 to 2 gallons of DEVOID concentrate per 1,000 square feet (40 to 80 gallons of DEVOID concentrate per acre).

TO CONTROL PERENNIAL WEEDS AND GRASSES such as smooth brome, Bahiagrass, bluegrass, redtop, purple top, quack grass, broomsedge, aster, dandelion, dog fennel, goldenrod, plantain and wild carrot: Apply 2 to 4 gallons of DEVOID concentrate per 1,000 square feet (80 to 160 gallons of DEVOID concentrate per acre).

TO CONTROL HARD-TO-KILL PERENNIAL WEEDS AND GRASSES such as Johnson grass, Bermuda grass, Dallis grass, nutgrass, Vaseygrass, sallgrass, bouncibet, dogbane, bracken fern and horsetail: Apply 3 to 5 gallons of DEVOID concentrate per 1,000 square feet (120 to 200 gallons of DEVOID concentrate per acre).

Use the higher levels of the dosage ranges on absorptive soils, lower levels in low rainfall areas.

When annual weeds or grasses reappear on treated sites, retreat with as little as 1 gallon of DEVOID concentrate per 1,000 square feet.

CAUTION: Contains petroleum distillates. Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin. Combustible. Causes skin irritation. Do not breathe the vapor or spray mist. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling. In case of contact wash skin with soap and water; flush eyes with large amounts of water and call a physician. Do not apply liquid to, or otherwise permit it to come into contact with susceptible plants such as vegetables, flowers, fruit trees, ornamentals, cotton, grapes or other desirable plants and do not permit spray mists containing it to drift
