Where local or state regulations are in effect, consult rules or your local authorities for volume of chlorine required for chlorine rinse solutions.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

1. Clean and rinse all equipment prior to disinfecting.
2. When used as a bactericide for dairy utensils, milking machines and equipment, use 1 1/2 ounces per 3 1/2 gallons of water. Test frequently to maintain a concentration above 50 ppm. Where facilities for testing chlorine residual are not available a starting solution of 200 ppm available chlorine is recommended. This solution can also be used for washing cows' udders and the milker's hands.
3. When used as a disinfectant for equipment in food and beverage plants, use a solution of 1 pound per 40 gallons of water and apply in such a manner that all parts and surfaces are properly reached with solution. Where facilities for testing chlorine residual are not available a starting solution of 200 ppm available chlorine is recommended.
4. For domestic and household, use a solution of 1 ounce per gallon of water for disinfecting glasses, dishes, etc. For cleaning and deodorizing of porcelain and enameled surfaces such as sinks, refrigerators, etc., use a solution of 1 ounce per quart of water.
