

POISON SIGNS (Symptoms)

Methyl Parathion is a very dangerous poison. It rapidly enters the body on contact with all skin surfaces and Eyes. Clothing wet with this material must be removed immediately. Exposed persons must receive prompt medical treatment or they may die. Some of the signs and symptoms of poisoning are: Headache, nausea, vomiting, cramps, weakness, blurred vision, pin-point pupils, tightness in chest, labored breathing, nervousness, sweating, watering of eyes, drooling or frothing of mouth and nose, muscle spasms and coma.

FIRST AID TREATMENT +

Call a doctor (physician), clinic or hospital immediately. Explain that the victim has been exposed to parathion and describe his andition. If breathing has stopped, start artificial respiration immediately and maintain until doctor sees victim. If swallowed and victim is awake (conscious) make him vomit quickly. Induce vomiting by sticking finger down throat or by giving soapy or strong salty water to drink. Repeat until vomit is clear. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Have victim lie down and keep quiet. See doctor immediately. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. See doctor immediately.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

ALFALFA AND VETCH: Spotted alfalfa aphid. Use 1½ pints of this product per acre. Do not apply within 15 days of harvest. Birds and other wildlife in treated areas may be killed.

SMALL GRAINS (wheat, barley, oats, rye): Greenbug, barley thrip d corn leaf aphids. Use 1½ pints of this product per acre. Do not apply within 15 days of harvest.

SUGARBRETS: Webworms. Use 11/2 pints of this product per acre. Do not apply within 2 days of harvest. If beet tops are to be fed to live tack do not apply within 60 days of harvest.

"Workers entering treated fields within 24 hours should wear protative clothing.

POST TREATED AREA: Consult your State Agricultural Extension Service or Experiment Station regarding posting treated areas.

"Do not reuse empty container. Destroy it by perforating or crush-, ing. Bury or discard in a safe place away from water supplies."

IMPORTANT! Before removing gloves, wash them with soap and water. Always wash hands, face and arms with soap and water before smoking, eating or drinking.

AFTER WORK, take off all work clothes and shoes. Shower, using soap and water. Wear only clean clothes when leaving job. Do not wear contaminated clothing. Wash protective clothing and protective equipment with soap and water after each use. Respirator should be cleaned and filter replaced according to instructions included with respirator.
