

Atrazine can leach through soil and can enter groundwater which may be used as drinking water. Atrazine has been found in groundwater. Users are advised not to apply atrazine to sand and loamy sand soils where the water table (groundwater) is close to the surface and where these soils are very permeable, i.e., well-drained. Your local agricultural agencies can provide further information on the type of soil in your area and the location of groundwater.

Apply between January 1 and March 31 (Florida and other southern states to June 15th) at the rate of 18 lbs. on 5,000 sq. ft.

CONTROLS SUCH WEEDS AS:

GERMINATING: Crabgrass, Barnyardgrass, Wiregrass, Paspalum Seedlings (Dallisgrass, Vaseygrass, Bahiagrass), Sedges (such as Cyperus Compressus), and Spurge.

ESTABLISHED AND GERMINATING: Betony, Blackmedic (yellow trefoil), Burclover, Chickweed, Dandelion, Oxalis, Florida Pusley, Pennyvort (Dollarweed), and Creeping Charlie (Matchweed).

For best results, apply before weeds come up (pre-emergent). Established weeds are more difficult to control and may require an application in Spring and Fall. On newly sprigged St. Augustine, Centipede, or Zoysia lawns, apply immediately after planting to prevent weeds from retarding growth. Water in well.

Approximately 4 weeks after initial treatment with product, an application of 16% or higher nitrogen fertilizer should be made at a rate of 6 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. and watered in well.

Storage: Store in original container in safe, dry place. Do not contaminate other pesticides, fertilizer, seeds, food or feed. Return spillage to original container prior to disposal.

Product Disposal: Securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.

Container Disposal: Do not re-use bag. Discard bag in trash.
