STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

IF SWALLOWED: Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Call a physician immediately. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

IF INHALED: Remove victim to fresh air. Apply respiration if indicated.

IF ON SKIN: Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with soap and water.

IF IN EYES: Flush eyes with plenty of water and get prompt medical attention.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN - Active ingredient is a cholinesterase inhibitor. Treat symptomatically. Atropine is an antidote.

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This product is toxic to fish, birds, and other wildlife. Do not apply directly to water. Do not apply where runoff is likely to occur. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Apply product uniformly to home lawns and other ornamental and recreational turfgrass areas using any hand or power operated gravity or rotary type spreader designed for application of granular materials. Treat when insects first appear, using product at the rate of 5 pounds per 1,000 sq. ft. To help obtain uniform distribution, apply one-half the required amount of product in one direction; then apply the balance at a right angle. Immediately after application, sprinkle the turf with 30 gallons of water per 1000 sq. ft. so as to wash the granules into the zone of insect infestation. Consult the following table to determine amounts of product and water needed for small sized areas. Retreat as necessary.

RATES TO USE

Areas to be Treated	Pounds of Product	Gals. of Water to Sprinkle on Turf after Treatment
1,000 sq. ft.	5	30
5,000 sq. ft.	25	150
10,000 sq. ft.	50	325

*Fire Ant Mounds: To control fire ants apply 4 ounces to each mound. After application of granules, sprinkle the mound with one gallon of water. For best results, apply in cool weather, 65-80° F, or in early morning or late evening hours. Treat new mounds as they appear.

**To control certain white grubs (larvae of European chafer and Japanese beetle) use two to four times the amounts of product shown in the table, i.e., 10 to 20 pounds per 1,000 sq. ft. Apply the granules uniformly over the area treated followed immediately by thorough watering to wash the insecticide into the turf. For best results, treat when grubs are young and actively feeding near the soil surface, usually during late July and August. Consult your local Agricultural Extension Service specialist for proper time to treat in your area.

Storage: Store in original container in safe, dry place. Do not contaminate other pesticides, fertilizer, seeds, food or feed. Return spillage to original container prior to disposal.

Product Disposal: Securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.

Container Disposal: Do not re-use bag. Discard bag in trash.

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
