INGREDIENT STATEMENT

Active Ingredients	
Steam Distilled Pine Oil	80.08%
Soda	7.03%
Isopropyl Alcohol	3.40%
Inert Ingredients	9.49%

Net Content: 1 Gallon of 5% Solution

DIRECTIONS:

For general cleaning, disinfecting and deodorizing maintainable surfaces. Should be applied liberally enough to wet surfaces thoroughly using mop, cloth, sponge or brush as applicable. May be used on surfaces which consist of wood, metal, floor, masonry, tile, etc. Wash and wringings before the product application. Follow use with a potable water rinse.

Recommended Solution Strengths

For Cleaning and Disinfecting: Use 2 ozs/gallon of water. As a Pot Shampoo: Leather animal with solution of 3 lbs/gallon of water. For Deodorizing: Use 2 1/2 ozs/gallon of water.

CAUTION: * KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN. Harmful if swallowed. Contact may irritate the eye.

FIRST AID: * Flush eyes with water, then with borax acid solution. In cases of ingestion, do not induce vomiting. If swallowed, drink large amount of water. Follow by two or three glasses of milk.
