



DUSTING: ROCKLAND VEGETABLE-TOMATO DUST is ready for use and may be dusted from the sifter can or used in a dust gun. For best results, apply in early morning or late afternoon. The quantity required will vary from 1/2 lb to 1 lb. per 1000 sq. ft.

SPRAYING: Premix sufficient water with 6 to 8 Tablespoons of ROCKLAND VEGETABLE-TOMATO DUST to form a thin, smooth paste. Add paste to water in garden sprayer to make one gallon of spray. Mix thoroughly. 1 lb. makes 10 gallons of spray.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Store unused material in original container only in a locked storage area out of reach of children and animals. Keep container tightly closed.

DISPOSAL: Do not reuse empty container. Securely wrap in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.
