 Dimethylamine salt of 2,4-dichlorophenoxyacetic Acid* 12.24%
 Dimethylamine salt of diramba** 3.80%
INERT INGREDIENTS: 83.96%
 *2,4-dichlorophenoxyacetic acid equivalent 10.24% by weight or 1 pound per gallon
 **3,6-dichloro-o-anisic acid equivalent 2.60% by weight or 1/4 pound per gallon

DIRECTIONS FOR USE ON LAWNS

Apply **DOUBLE-D LAWN WEED KILLER** any time weeds are growing actively - spring, summer or fall. Spray when the air is calm, to avoid spray drift that might injure desirable plants.

Newly seeded lawns may be treated after they have been mowed at least twice. To re-seed small areas in treated lawns, wait at least 3 weeks after spraying. A good rain or deep watering should occur during this period. A few weeds, such as henbit that emerge early in the year as wild garlic and onion that emerge early in the year should be sprayed in early spring.

AMOUNTS TO USE

PRECAUTIONS

Do not use **DOUBLE-D LAWN WEED KILLER** for controlling weeds in flower or vegetable beds, shrubs or ornamental plantings, Lippia and Dichondra plants.

No weed spraying should be attempted during periods of drought, unless the lawn is watered thoroughly several days before treatment.

A separate sprayer should be kept for weed killing because 2,4-D and related chemicals are difficult to clean from equipment.

HOSE ATTACHED SPRAYERS — LAWN MODELS: Use 3 tablespoons of **DOUBLE-D LAWN WEED KILLER** diluted with water to the 3 to 5 gallon mark on the spray jar for each 500 sq. feet (25 x 20') of lawn area to be sprayed. Adjust water pressure so that spray streams about 10-15 feet with no misting. Take usual precautions to prevent spray drift.

WEEDS IN VACANT LOTS, FENCEROWS AND SIMILAR AREAS

To kill thistles, ragweed, morning glory, dock and many other broadleaf weeds, spray when these weeds are growing actively and are in the bud to flower stage. Wet all weeds thoroughly. Spray any regrowth if it develops.

AMOUNTS TO USE

1/2 pint	5-6 gallons
1 pint	10-15 gallons
1 quart	20-30 gallons

Do not use the same spray equipment for other purposes. Do not store near fertilizers, seeds, insecticides or fungicides. Do not apply within the drip line or root system of trees and shrubs. Do not use this product for purposes other than those recommended on the label.
