DIRECTIONS

UNPLANTED AREAS: Apply 1 pint per acre on annuals and 1 quart per acre if perennials are a problem. Remove treated area from crop production until chemical has been inactivated in the soil.

LAWNS AND GOLF FAIRWAYS: Apply 1-2 pints per acre depending on weed infestation and season of year. Avoid use on bent grass and clover.

Add above quantities to liquid carrier at time of application. Quantity of spray solution will depend on equipment but in general 3-5 gallons in low volume sprayers and 125-150 gallons in high volume equipment is sufficient per acre. Low pressures of 15-50 lbs. are most desirable. Young vigorously growing weeds are most susceptible. 2-4 weeks may pass before kill is evident. Perennial weeds may require re-treatment of areas infested.
