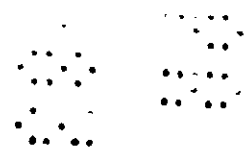

Restricted Use Pesticide

For application only by or under the direct supervision of a certified applicator.

Applicators must wear the following protective clothing during the application process: a light-weight protective suit or coveralls; water-resistant hat; unlined, waterproof gloves; and unlined, light-weight boots. Mixers and loaders must also wear goggles or a face shield, waterproof gloves and a waterproof apron.

PURINA Insect Killer is very effective when used as directed. It kills by contact action. One thorough treatment of animal will often kill all pests. When dusted about buildings, PURINA Insect Killer may be effective for several weeks if powder is undisturbed.

For Dusting Animals

For Lice, Ticks, Fleas and Sheep Keds on Beef Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, Goats, Horses, or Mules: Dust animal thoroughly, rubbing the powder well into the coat of the infested area. Repeat treatment if animal becomes reinfested.

For Lice, Fleas, and Ticks on Dogs and Foxes: Dust powder well into the hair coat, particularly along the back line from the base of the tail to the head. To aid in controlling ticks and fleas, also dust kennels, hutches, bedding or litter. Repeat treatment when necessary. This product should be applied in a well-ventilated area.

For Building Use

For Roaches, Spiders, Silverfish, Crickets, Odorous House Ant, and Little Black Ant: Dust powder into cracks, along baseboards, in corners, around water pipes, runways or wherever insects hide. Repeat if necessary.

For Carpet Beetles: Treat localized areas of room, under furniture, around margin of rugs and over baseboards where insects are seen. Do not apply to large areas of the rug or floor.

Applicators working in enclosed areas, such as crawl space, must wear a respirator approved by OSHA.

Do not use in edible products areas of food processing plants, restaurants or other areas where food is commercially prepared or processed. Do not use in serving areas while food is exposed.

CAUTION: Avoid inhalation. May cause irritation of nose and throat. May be absorbed through skin. Wash hands thoroughly after using this product.

Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs. Do not treat within 30 days of slaughter. Do not use on dairy goats. Do not use on hogs within two weeks of farrowing nor for at least three weeks thereafter. Do not treat animals under three months of age. Do not apply directly to areas of skin affected by mange, eczema, summer itch, or similar open sores. Avoid treating overheated or sick animals.

This product is toxic to fish and wildlife. Keep out of lakes, ponds or streams. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment, or disposal of wastes. Apply this product only as specified on this label.

Storage and Disposal

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Pesticide Disposal: Pesticide wastes are toxic. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of federal law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. A Symptoms of Poisoning section must be added to the label in close proximity to the STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT; we suggest the following:

"SYMPTOMS OF POISONING: headache, nausea, dizziness, loss of equilibrium, muscle spasms, difficulty in breathing, hyper-excitability and convulsions."

2. A STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT must be added to the labeling. We suggest the following statement, however, if your toxicological data suggests otherwise, please submit a draft STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT for prior approval:

"STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If swallowed-Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately.
Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching the back of throat with finger. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

If inhaled- Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.

If on skin- Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected area with soap and water.

If in eyes- Flush eyes with plenty of water. Call a physician if irritation persists."

3. Move the "KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN" to appear immediately above the front panel signal word.

4. Immediately preceding "Applicators must wear..." on the second page of the draft labeling, insert the following:

"DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling."

5. To the applicator protective clothing add the following:

"a paper dust mask."

6. Immediately preceding "CAUTION: Avoid inhalation..." insert the following headings:

"PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS"

7. Under "HAZARDS TO HUMANS..." revise the following:

"Wash hands thoroughly after using this product and before eating or smoking."

(Underscoring indicates added text and should not be reproduced on the label.)

8. Immediately preceding "This product is toxic to fish..." insert the following heading:

"ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS".

Submit five (5) copies of your revised final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the amended labeling.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

If you hold a Federal registration, a supplemental registration, or a Special Local Needs registration, you may continue to produce new stocks of such products, using current labeling, until April 1, 1984. After that date, all remaining inventories of affected products will fall under the Existing Stocks provisions stated in our letter of October 28, 1983.
