DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Formulators are responsible for obtaining EPA registration for their formulated products.

For formulation into end-use insecticide products intended only for the following uses:

INDOOR:

Stored commodity treatment on Corn, Barley, Oats, Rye and Wheat.

NOTE TO FORMULATORS

Certain organophosphate insecticides have been shown to cause staining and color changes of carpets dyed with certain sensitive carpet dyes. Products made from this concentrate should carry warnings to prevent contact with carpeting by spray, spray mist or drift.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage and disposal. Open dumping is prohibited.

STORAGE: If container is damaged: Stop any leaks by repositioning the container or by patching or otherwise repairing the leaks. Take care to avoid contact with pesticide and wear protective gear. On cleanup, wear protective equipment as required to prevent contact with the product. Sweep on to a shovel and put the sweepings into a salvage drum. Dispose of wastes as below.
